Patrice D. Cani is a full professor of physiology, metabolism, and nutrition at UCLouvain (Brussels, Belgium). He is vice-president of the Louvain Drug Research Institute (LDRI) and affiliated with the Institute of Experimental and Clinical Research (IREC). He has also been a visiting professor at the Faculty of Medicine of Imperial College London. Trained as a dietitian, he joined the Faculty of Medicine at UCLouvain, where he earned two Master's degrees (Human Nutrition and Health Sciences) as well as a PhD in Biomedical Sciences. His research focuses on nutrition and the role of the gut microbiota in obesity, overweight, type 2 diabetes, inflammation, cardiovascular diseases, and certain cancers. He has received numerous prestigious awards and he has also been the recipient of two ERC grants. He is full member of the Royal Academy of Medicine of Belgium and author of more than 400 scientific publications, reviews, and book chapters (74,000 citations (h index: 120, Scopus) and over 104,600 citations (h-index: 140, Google Scholar, September 2025). Since 2016, he has also been listed among Clarivate's "Highly Cited Researchers" and appears in Stanford University's "World's Top 2% Scientists list," highlighting the international impact of his work.
